Kangaroo Island Community Education

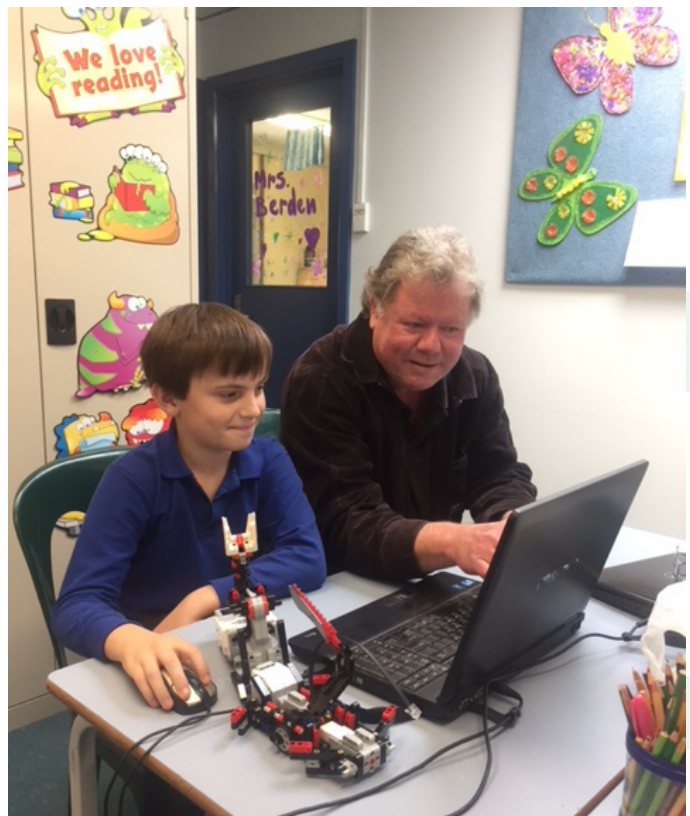
Kangaroo Island Community Education has three campuses over the Island, The Learning assistance Program is only at the Kingscote Campus which is the largest of the campuses with 400+ students from years R – 12.

The program has 6 volunteers at present and 19 students. One of these very special volunteers John, who volunteers 2 full days and works with 12 students from year 2 to year 7 building robotics. John started in 2015 using his own equipment with 1 student. As John was able to work with more students the school purchased a Lego Megamind Robotic Kit so John could expand on the students’ knowledge. John starts coding a game and gradually gets them into coding and building a robot. The robots can do various challenges like solving a Rubik’s cube.

John has bought a new respect for the program from both the students and teachers. With more teachers seeing the value of the program and students happy to be a LAP student.

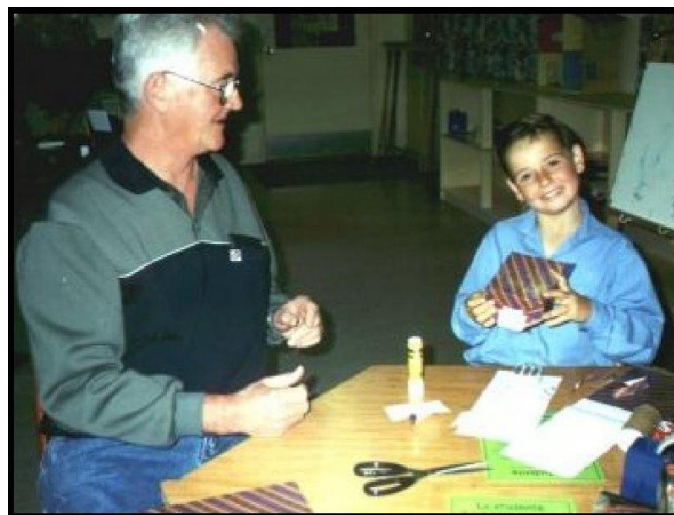
I would like to acknowledge another volunteer who has shared the last 20 years with me as a volunteer as well, and that is Ron Wallis.

WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING WITH YOUR ASSOCIATION



LAP Survey

Thanks again to everyone who participated in our Member Survey. Below is a recap of some of the findings from the survey.

About LAP

- A slight majority of survey respondents (57%) indicated that the name LAP adequately explains the program.*
- 100% of respondents agreed that the students involved benefit from LAP.

About LAP Services

- 81% of respondents indicated that they would like to see more training workshops for mentors/volunteers and 73% indicated that they would like to see more training workshops for coordinators.
- 33% of respondents indicated that they cannot access LAP member benefits. This is mostly due to distance and time constraints.
- 71% of respondents indicated that they felt LAP membership was value for money.

As an Association committee, we are looking at how to address feedback we have received to ensure that members can access resources and support they require.

Mentoring .. WIIFBOU

(What's in it for both of us?)
